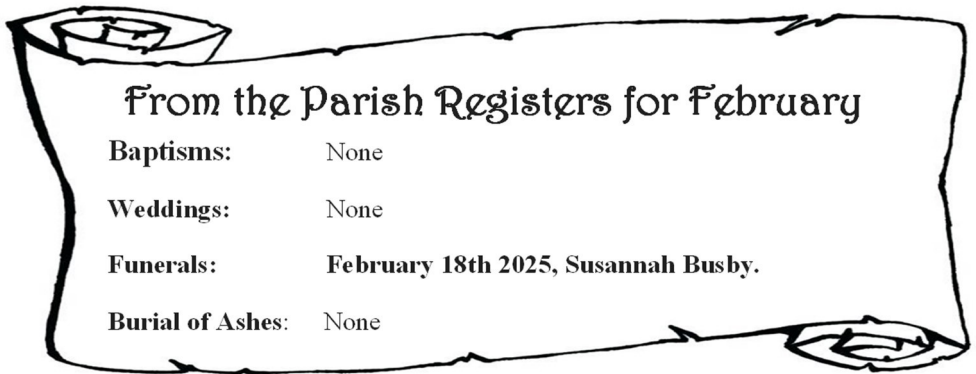

Christ, whose glory fills the skies
Christ, the true, the only light.
Sun of righteousness arise
Triumph o'er the shades of night;

Day star in my heart appear

A beautiful hymn, all three verses. The writer of this hymn, John Wesley, may have drawn inspiration from the seasons of the sky, day and night. Night skies can be very beautiful, and the day star appears just before dawn, announcing the new day is arriving. With the glory of a clear blue Spring sky, after the gloom of

Winter, everyone seems to go about their day with a much lighter heart.

Dark and cheerless is the morn
Unaccompanied by Thee
Joyless is the day's return
Till Thy mercy's beams I see.
Till Thy inward light impart,
Glad my eyes, and warm my heart.

How often do we wake to gloom or cold rain, that does not cheer the heart. Yet for the people of God, we have another source of light. The Treadmill of life can seem a joyless return for many. Wesley knew this was so, but he also knew another source of cheer and light, Thy mercy's beams. Lord have mercy, Christ have

mercy, Lord have mercy. Impart The inward light upon us especially during this season of insecurity through change imposed upon us during interregnum, until it is over; glad our eyes and warm our hearts.

Visit then this soul of mine,
Pierce the gloom of sin and grief;
Fill me, Radiance divine,
Scatter all my unbelief;
More and more Thyself display,
Shining to the perfect day.

Wesley shows the way to pray for that perfect day in this last verse; a way to the true light. The gloom caused by sin and regret; our lack of faith and trust; our belief "Lord, I believe, help Thou my unbelief". More and more Thyself display; hopefully within ourselves but, perhaps more so, seeing Christ displayed more

and more in others. The perfect day has to be seeing Jesus face to face.

Time

Time - it's a funny thing. Sometimes there doesn't seem to be enough of it; sometimes it drags. Granny used to say it goes more quickly as you get older - I didn't believe her then, but now I think she was right. And even on a day when I think I won't have time to do everything I need to get done, somehow time stretches and there is enough of it after all.

Soldiers mark time by standing still; time never does. We watch the seconds, minutes, hours ticking by and can do nothing to stop them. The year divides neatly up into four periods of time: the Winter quarter has ended; Spring began on 21st March. Very soon after Spring begins the clocks change; and my body clock has to change too. We say that when the clocks change in the Spring we 'lose' an hour. But of course we don't. All we lose is an hour's sleep - and that takes a few days to get used to. Never mind, we get the hour back when the clocks change the other way in the Autumn!

Time is at a premium for the Christian as we follow the Lord through his Passion, Death and Resurrection. Listing the times when we are asked to come together to keep the week we call Holy Week takes up a whole page in this edition of the magazine. We are asked to sacrifice an amount of time, a considerable amount of time. But it is wonderful time; it is time the Lord asks of us.

You will remember that he asked some of his closest friends for some time - just a small amount of time. Time to do what? Not to indulge in any strenuous activity, not to do a particular job. Time simply to be with him, to keep company with him as he spent time in prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane after they had shared a final meal together.

The trouble was they were tired; they couldn't keep awake; they couldn't use the time - just a small amount of time - in the way the Lord asked them.

If we keep Holy Week in the way the Lord asks of us we too will be tired. And yet, strangely some might think, the tiredness seems to melt away as we reach the climax of the holy days the Lord asks us to observe. And as the bells ring out in the great liturgy of Holy Saturday night as the Easter Vigil moves forward into the First Mass of Easter, the joy of Christ who is alive lifts the tiredness which has accumulated in the previous days.

Keep Holy Week faithfully. Make the effort. Put up with the tiredness, the physical and emotional tiredness that comes to those who keep Holy Week in the way the Lord asks. And know such great joy as we celebrate Christ's victory over the power of sin and death, and the gift he has given to us of eternal life with him in heaven - where (rejoice!) time and its constraints and limitations will be no more.

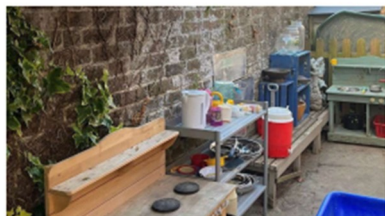

Cuppa and Chat with Deacon Rachel ~ Lois Watson



Lois Watson was born in St Richard's Hospital, Chichester in 1946. Her father was the Rector of St George's Whyke and her mother was a Home Economics teacher. Lois was later joined by her brother David, and they lived in the large rectory with Granny (her dad's mother) and Aunty Prue (his sister). Granny was bedbound due to a heart condition and

Lois remembers spending hours lying next to her listening to stories about her dad's childhood. It's no surprise that Lois's early memories of church focus around the life and worship of St George's, where she was baptised when she was just one month old. She remembers attending Christmas Parties for clergy children at the Bishop's Palace. She was confirmed by Bishop Bell in 1957 who was a frequent visitor at the Rectory.

She went to Whyke Infants' school which was just over the road from the Rectory and then moved to the Central school which was on the other side of Chichester. She would walk there and back with her friends twice a day. Her reward for passing the 11+ was a bike, which she proudly rode to Chichester Girls' Grammar school, picking up friends on the way. One distinct memory is when she walked into the kitchen at home and found her parents chatting quietly. She was soon to discover that they were moving to Hertfordshire where her dad was going to serve as Chaplain and Classics teacher at St Margaret's school. So, Lois finished off her school education in Hertfordshire.

After school she trained at a private secretarial college off Bond Street where she flourished. She had a job at the Metal Box offices in Baker Street and shared a flat with her friend and really enjoyed living in London.

When her parents returned to Sussex where her father was Vicar of Boxgrove and Tangmere, Lois decided to go with them to Sussex. One of her claims to fame is that she was working for the Probationary Service which was in the Court House when the Rolling Stones were in court.

With Mel, her first husband, they moved first to Birmingham, then Cardiff and eventually returned to Sussex. They lived in the Vicarage for a while and then moved to Tangmere with James and Christopher their sons.

When she and Mel divorced Lois moved to Rustington to work for an accountancy firm in Worthing, then Rustington. She was with that company for 20 years. Before leaving she had taken on the role of Practice Manager and HR which she really enjoyed. Her final post was in Bognor with an organisation running private children's homes which was rewarding. Alongside employment Lois found time to volunteer with the Samaritans as a listener for about 20 years, which was an honour and privilege.

Lois met Dave in 1992, and they moved into their home in 1994 along with some of their children. Initially, she went to St Andrew's Tarring, which is close to her home and then to St John's in 1996 which had been her Godmother's spiritual home. She was so warmly welcomed that she never looked back. Lois continues to use her administrative and secretarial skills in the parish office, which is greatly appreciated.

Lois's favourites:

Food – There is no contest here. If in France it would be a bowl of langoustines, a glass of muscadet, followed by fresh fruit preferably cherries. At home, roast chicken dinner and all the trimmings.

Drink – White wine, a glass of whiskey and a G&T after church on Sunday.

Book – Crime fiction

Music – doesn't play a big part in Lois's life, but she remembers, as a child, hiding under the bedcovers reading the English Hymnal, she loved the long words! She remembers fondly attending a Beatles Christmas Concert when she was in London.

TV – She enjoys watching quiz programmes, crime dramas and keeping up with current affairs.

Holidays – Lois and Dave had a caravan for many years and toured round Europe and the UK. One memorable holiday was around Ireland and northern and southern Ireland, the scenery was breathtaking! France has always played an important part in her life from childhood Her parents had a holiday home there and her brother had some land which was used by all the family for camping and caravaning. Sadly, they have had to give up the caravan.

Thank you, Lois, for sharing some of your life story with us. I am sure there is still much more to hear!

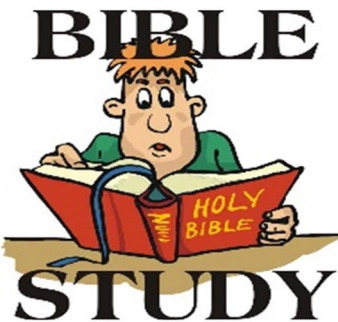


WADARS ENTHUSIASTS!
