Alice explained:

"The Survivors are here today to introduce their new name and logo. It was decided the name Survivors had too many other meanings so we needed to change it. We thought long and hard before we voted on a final 3 names. We decided ... (drum roll) ..we would name ourselves **SJ Ignite**. We felt this was good as burning is in our faith in lots of ways: for example, the burning bush, Pentecost, the candles in church and the thurible. We wanted to show that the group lights up our soul. After mass we would like you to join us to celebrate the launch with our cake.
